General Manager's Message

Greetings Golfers

Everyone reading this has heard it from me before, but it truly was great to see how we finished 2025 at Buffalo Golf Club. The course was in fantastic condition, and there were a lot of positive changes taking shape. I've thanked the maintenance crew many times and will gladly do it again—Jeff and his entire team put in an incredible amount of work, and how much they care really showed this year.

I'd also like to highlight our Superintendent, Jeff Lipics, who was instrumental in turning the course around. Things were bleak in the spring, but Jeff stayed positive, kept his crew focused, and worked seven days a week to get us where we are today. We're fortunate to have him at BGC, and I'm excited to see what the future holds. Our shared focus right now is healthy turf, and Jeff will speak more on that, but I wanted to personally thank him and his crew for a spectacular 2025.

This winter we have a few projects we are tackling on the golf course, and the biggest one is to improve playing conditions around a few green complexes and teeing areas. Due to roots infringing onto a few greens and once small trees being planted too close to greens, they have now become an issue, and we are beginning to see turf health on greens and their surrounds start to deteriorate every season.

To improve these areas, we will be taking down a few trees on 5 different areas of the golf course. In all areas you will see a definite improvement in playability and healthy grass, and site lines will improve drastically as well, so I am eager to see them complete. There are a few spots where I wish nothing had to be done, but the grass is so poor, and the roots are taking over that we are left with no other option than to remove the trees causing the damage. I do feel like over time the area will look better and better but I can guarantee it will be a shock at first. This was a decision that was not taken lightly but after much discussion between the Board, Jeff and me, it simply came down to a choice between grass or trees. We were stuck with a tough decision to make, but ultimately, we need healthy grass and playable greens.

In terms of the restaurant our goal has always been to focus on the golfers, and the Bison House continues to grow and improve each year thanks to Dana and our head cook, Dayton Cudmore. They work tirelessly to make sure everything is done right. Thank you to both of them, the entire Bison House team, and everyone who continues to support the restaurant—it truly means a lot to us.

After a slow start due to tough spring weather, the golf course had a very busy year, especially in August and September. When it's busy, the golf shop can be challenging to keep up with, particularly in a year where many staff members took on new responsibilities. One thing you could always count on, though, was a smile and great customer service from Nik, Wyatt, and our part-time staff. Nik and Wyatt are currently working seasonally in Florida, and I'm excited for their return in the spring with new skills and experience. Nik was promoted to a more supervisory role at Adios Golf Club this year, and Wyatt is spending time at Royal Poinciana Golf Club in Naples—both are in great positions that will help them grow in this business, and we look forward to having them back in the spring.

I also want to touch on PGA HOPE and our veteran programming. In 2025, we added eight more graduates, bringing our total to 21—something we're extremely proud of, especially since the program didn't exist four years ago. With this growth, we're excited to offer more opportunities for our graduates to get on the course in 2026, and that's a personal goal of mine. PGA HOPE provides six weeks of free instruction to veterans of all skill levels. If you or a veteran you know is interested, please reach out to me directly. Thank you as well to everyone who supported our veteran fundraising events—because of you, we were able to provide golf equipment to graduates who needed it.

Thank you all for a great 2025. We wish you a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year—2026 is shaping up to be another great year at Buffalo Golf Club.

President's Message

Fellow Golfers,

Looking back on another season at Buffalo Golf Club, I want to begin with a sincere thank you to the people who truly make our course what it is—our outstanding staff. From the grounds crew to the pro shop and food and beverage teams, their dedication, professionalism, and hard work are evident every single day.

This season came with its share of challenges, as many of you know, but our staff met each one head-on. Despite some early setbacks in the spring, they delivered exceptional results, and we're incredibly proud of how the course looked as the season progressed. I can confidently say Buffalo Golf Club was put to rest for the winter in as good of condition as we've seen in years. A heartfelt thank you to Dan, Jeff, Dana, and our entire team for working tirelessly each day to improve the course and the overall golf experience for us all.

As we continue to strive to make Buffalo Golf Club the best it can be, it's worth re-mentioning a point Jeff made in his message above: golf courses require time and money. It's no secret that as a non-profit organization operating a public golf course in Wyoming, both of those resources are limited, which makes efficiency very important—particularly when affordability remains a top priority for the Board.

That's why we're very pleased to share that the **prices for our 2026 season passes and green fees will remain the same for the third consecutive season.** Keeping golf accessible and affordable reflects thoughtful planning, responsible financial management, and BGC's ongoing commitment to our community.

Some other good news and highlights from the year and looking into 2026 include:

- BGC hosted **approximately 22,000 rounds of golf in 2025**, well above the national average for seasonal courses. This included multiple high school and junior events and numerous tournaments—many benefiting local and regional nonprofit organizations.

- Our **junior and veteran programming continues to thrive and grow**, creating meaningful opportunities both on and off the course. Our veteran programs, in particular, are doing truly remarkable work for a very deserving population, and there is nothing else like it in our region. Great job and thank you to Dan for his leadership and commitment to making those programs such a success.
- There were also several important infrastructure improvements made across the course. Approximately four miles of deteriorated asphalt cart paths were removed, with the majority replaced by grass. While a few areas will still need concrete—hopefully in 2026 when weather allows—this was a major step forward. **Thank you very much to the City of Buffalo, Johnson County, the Optional One Percent Sales Tax Board, and the Johnson County Recreation District Board for supporting this project!**
- The city also helped us fix a leaking pipe that was buried deeper than our equipment could handle, so **thank you to Kevin Silbernagel and his crew for their assistance as well!**
- We also installed new bridges and began reworking some of the stairs on the course, thanks in large part to the dedication of **one of our incredible volunteers, Mike Pertile**. I know Mike doesn't want the recognition (sorry, Mike), but we truly could not have done those projects without him.
- Looking ahead, this winter and spring we'll be extending portions of the irrigation system to help water more efficiently in certain areas, and we're continuing to invest in our tree management program as Dan discussed above. While this does include removing some trees that are encroaching on greens and tee boxes and impacting turf health, we'll also be planning for strategic tree planting in select areas as time and budget allow.
- Lastly, we launched an Online Pro Shop, which offers a wider range of products, brands, and sizes. You can still pick up some of our awesome merchandise in-person at the clubhouse, but this will give us all and our visitors more flexibility to shop BGC branded apparel and accessories for adults and kids. On behalf of our dedicated Board of Directors—Bill Poniatowski, Sandi Bidonde, Brett McCoy, Barb Hodgson, John Taylor, and myself—thank you all for your continued support of Buffalo Golf Club. Also, to our other volunteers that I didn't mention, who've offered their time, talents, and expertise this past year, we are incredibly grateful for your help!
